

Effective Tabling Techniques & Tips

Philosophy

When I table, I'm "selling" information/ideas Educate & Engage

Tactical/personal decision to include shocking or graphic factory farming images
Buy or salvage materials for tabling

Key Factors

Who is the audience? veg? non-veg?

What is the purpose? distribute info, build brand, raise \$, promote program etc.

At a Glance: Who, What, Why

Before The Event

Logistics

Display space/size of table

Indoor or outdoor?

If outdoor: <u>sun</u>-bring a hat or a canopy; <u>wind</u>-bring weights/rocks/make sure everything is secure; <u>rain</u>-bring a raincoat and plastic sheet to cover the display

Carrying display materials (box, dolly)

Project planning → leadtime

- Identify what literature you'll need (know the literature/avoid duplicates)
 - Order & delivery time (or development)
 - Volunteer scheduling
 - Mount posters, make/buy stand-ups

Gather Essential Elements

- Literature & literature holders
- Donation Jar (start it off with a few bucks, have change) / Signs asking for donations
- * Tool box scissors, tape, string, pen, felt tip marker, paper, binder clips, rubber bands
- 1 Tablecloth is a nice touch (flat bedsheet works oo!)
- List of Monthly Events (for display)
- * "Free Membership Today" sign
- **♣** BAV business cards (with URL → direct people to website, avoid paper giveaway)
 - ♣ Clipboard/sign-up sheet/pen on string
 - ₩ Water & food

Look at the booth from a visitor's perspective Practice your set-up

During The Event

Positive Attitude -- Smile * Have fun © * You are the "face" of vegetarianism at that moment.

Greet people, tell them all the literature is free, donations appreciated

- § "Where do you live?" → events in their area
- § "Are you already veg or thinking about it?" →
 suggest literature

Encourage sign-ups

Draw attention to key features of (monthly events, useful program, etc)

Take pictures of your display & the volunteers, people visiting the booth, etc.

Straighten/restock the display periodically

After The Event

- A Make note of what worked/didn't work for next time. Give feedback to the team as appropriate.
 - 1 Thank you's to volunteers, etc.
 - Restock literature so you're set to go
 - ♣ Report Advocacy Rewards Program points ©
